Celebrating 30 years of francophone cinema in Vancouver!

The 30th Rendez-vous du cinéma québécois et francophone de Vancouver will be presented online and in theatres in February and March 2024. A series of gala evenings will be held in the presence of special guests, including **Michel Coulombe**, who contributed to the creation of the Rendez-vous du cinéma québécois in British Columbia.

To mark this important milestone, encounters, conferences and workshops round out the program, aimed at the general public as well as school audiences. The Québec films **Testament**, **Ru**, **Kanaval**, **Les jours heureux**, **Tu ne sauras jamais**, as well as a wide selection of shorts and documentaries, including **L'océan vu du cœur** will be featured. Programming as part of the Printemps de la Francophonie will follow in March in a number of locations and cities, combined with permanent online programming on the Eventive platform.org.

The next generation! A new component, the Festival du très court métrage, is aimed at 12-18 years old who will produce 30 sec. to 3 minutes films, using smartphones. This will be followed by the Salon du cinéma in March, where training sessions with professionals and a 48-hour competition will enable young people to familiarize themselves and experiment with various film-related professions.

Régis Painchaud and Lorraine Fortin from Visions Ouest Productions are proposing quite a program for the 30th anniversary. "The 30th Rendez-vous du cinéma québécois et francophone offers a unique opportunity to provide Western Francophones and Francophiles an open window on the cinematic excellence of the national and international Francophonie".







Amir Amiri Ensemble

Santur player, composer, and cultural inventor **Amir Amiri** from Québec dwells at the centre of a unique musical universe where ancient inspiration, dazzling virtuosity, and bold creativity meet. Surrounding himself with outstanding collaborators from the worlds of jazz, classical and world music, Amiri fearlessly transcends genres and borders, exquisitely transporting his ancient instrument into the musical conversations of our time.

This award-winning artist from Québec was born in Tehran, Iran. Amiri is a master of the santur, a 72-string instrument dating from approximately 500 BCE. Since arriving in Canada in 1996, Amiri has created numerous groundbreaking ensembles including the **Amir Amiri Ensemble**, inspired by the fluidity of musical influences in Iran and featuring the hypnotic presence of a Whirling Dervish. Virtuoso musicians are part of the ensemble: **Amir Amiri** (santur), **Abdul-Wahab Khayyali** (oud), **Reza Abaee** (ghaychak), **Omar Abu Afech** (Viola), and **Hamin Honari** (percussion).

Known for his profound connection with audiences, this is a show not to be missed!

The theme for the 2024 Toronto French Book Fair will be *Ontario*, *I Love You... in French!*

While paraphrasing the title of the novel by Franco-Ontarian Didier Leclair, *Toronto, I love you*, the Salon aims to celebrate Franco-Ontarian and Canadian books, their artisans, their public, as well as Franco-Canadian publishers.



On this occasion, authors from Canada, including several from Québec, and Louisiana will participate in literary activities: panels, conferences, signing sessions, round tables, workshops and shows. Publishers will also be present to offer a fine selection of books in French.

The partnership between the Toronto French Book Fair and the Rimouski Book Fair, a real tradition, will now take on a new dimension in 2024: a group of authors from the Rimouski region will present new works on the theme *Ontario*, *I love you...* in *French!* Just like a group of poets from the Trois-Rivières International Poetry Festival.

The honorary president of this 31st edition of the Toronto French Book Fair will be Dyane Adam, founding president and governor-emeritus of the Governing Council of the Université de l'Ontario français, and former Commissioner of Official Languages of Canada.

To date, **Pépite et Josèphe** have created a dozen bespoke paintings for private living spaces. This unique approach to commissions, known as tableaux-extension, is an important part of their artistic approach.



The intimate meets the universal in this 100% cathartic documentary play that, in telling the true story of one woman's journey to obtain support and services for her daughter, rips away any illusions we may still have about the inclusiveness of our society. In a labyrinthine playground set, the protagonist goes in search of answers from a constellation of characters—43 in all, all played by the incredible **Julie Le Breton**, who gives a dazzlingly versatile performance before our astonished eyes.
